It is my pleasure to bring before you the first volume of the quarterly newsletter of Nandankanan, a new initiative aimed at showcasing the notable events in the zoo. During this quarter, the newly constructed Multi Level Car Parking, the first of its kind in our country, was inaugurated by Sri Naveen Patnaik, Hon'ble Chief Minister, Odisha on 27th May 2022. Following up on learnings during the covid crisis, we have constantly worked on new innovations aimed at enhancing visitor satisfaction. One such initiative was the installation of free wi-fi service to the visitors at the ticket counter and entry gate. Our zoo has always led from the front on education and awareness initiatives and the grand celebration of the World Environment Day was no exception. In addition, provision of QR code-based audio-signage for animal enclosures and QR codeenabled name-plates for plants installed at different strategic locations were further steps. We had many new births in the zoo during this period and could successfully incubate two species of snake eggs, thereby adding much-needed knowledge to the standardization of artificial incubation techniques in reptiles. We are very grateful to all our donors and patrons for their support inour animal adoption scheme, which will go a long way in ensuring welfare of the zoo inmates. It has been a very happening time on the HR front too and we are happy to Conservator of Forests and one Range Officer to the staff regularized to Group-D position against the existing vacancy. Two Research Associates were also recruited to further the research activities in the zoo. It was our privilege to welcome Dr Sanjay Shukla, IFS, Member Secretary, Central Zoo Authority at Nandankanan on 14th and 15th June and we are very grateful to him for his gracious appreciation and valuable suggestions.

Before I conclude, I must thank the Deputy Director and all the members of Team Nandankanan who work relentlessly for taking the zoo to the next level with an aim of transforming it to a world-class institution. Shri Shashi Paul, PCCF (WL) and Chief Wildlife Warden with his calm demeanor and sagacious advice has always been a bedrock of support for Nandankanan and we are most grateful to him for his guidance.

About Us

Nandankanan Zoological Park is one of the finest large zoos of the country. It was established on 29th December, 1960. The State Botanical Garden with an area of 75 hectares is situated adjoining to the Zoological Park. Nandankanan has two important wetlands namely Kanjia lake (66 ha.) and Kiakani lake. Kanjia lake has been included in the list of wetlands of Government of India in the year 2006 due to its biodiversity. The Zoological Park together with Kanjia lake and Botanical Garden has been declared as Nandankanan Wildlife Sanctuary over an area of 4.37 sq.km. (Notified on 3rd August, 1979). Nandankanan is not only a Zoological Park, but also an ideal centre for Research, Education, Conservation breeding and above all it has emerged as a centre of Excellence in the field of zoo management in India. The park is under the management of the Government of Odisha, Forest & Environment Department under the control of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (Wildlife) & Chief Wildlife Warden, Odisha.

To achieve the distinction of an outstanding zoo through World Class Conservation, Education, Research and Exciting visitor experiences by connecting people to biodiversity conservation.

VISION

Glimpses of Important **Events**

Inauguration of Multi-Level Car Parking facility

Multi-Level Car Parking (MLCP) facility of Nandankanan was inaugurated on 27th May, 2022 by Sri Naveen Patnaik, Hon'ble Chief Minister, Odisha.Sri Bikram Keshari Arukha, Hon'ble Minister of Forest, Environment & Climate Change and Parliamentary Affairs, Odisha, Sri Susant Kumar Rout, Hon'ble, MLA, Bhubaneswar (North), Dr Mona Sharma, IAS, ACS, Forest, Environment & Climate Change, Sri Sisir Kumar Ratho, IFS, PCCF & HOFF (Odisha), Senior officials from Forest, Works and other Departments, Local PRI members and citizens, Nandankanan staff, print and electronic media were present during the ceremony.



The Multi-Level Car Parking building has a three storied parking facility over total 5.0-acre area with a built-up area of 16800 sq. mt (G+2F) and a capacity to accommodate parking for 583 (151+151+151+130) cars. The estimated cost of the facility is Rs. 3542.79 Lakhs. Driver rest rooms, drinking water and snack kiosks, CCTV monitoring, elevator, ramps and landing facilities for visitors along with wash room for both gents and ladies for visitors have been provided. The open areas adjacent to MLCP have been developed with paver tiles and landscaped for safe accommodation of 2000 nos of motor cycle and cycles. Boom bar for car entry with digital ticketing system have been provided. The facility not only provides safe parking of 583 cars at a time but also addresses the issues for traffic jam and rush at main PWD Road from Nandankanan Police Station to Barang By-Pass Road.



FREE Wi-fi SERVICE TO VISITORS

High speed free wi-fi service was made available to the visitors at ticket counters and entry gate for taking online tickets, payment of counter tickets through UPI & browsing Nandankanan website and app.

CELEBRATION OF WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY 2022

Nandankanan Zoological Park celebrated the World Environment Day on 5th June, 2022 by organizing a series of activities and events in off-line and on-line mode to spread awareness to the public and visitors on environmental issues. The day started with a cleanliness drive of zoo premises where senior officials of zoo along with staff and zoo guides cleaned the

More than 200 nos of different types of plants like Sansveria green, Sansveria trifasciata golden, Madaranga red, Madaranga green, Golden grass, Rhoeo plant and Dwarf satabari have been displayed infront of State Botanical Garden main gate.



Animal in focus:

Hippopotamus

Hippopotamus amphibius

The hippopotamus, also known as the "river horse" lives along the rivers and lakes throughout sub-Saharan Africa. Weighing up to 8,000 pounds, the hippo is the heaviest land animal after the elephant. Hippos seek refuge from the heat by living in water during the day, and at night they come ashore to feed on short, soft grasses and fallen fruit. The eyes and ears of a hippopotamus are on top of its head, so it



can keep watch for enemies mainly crocodiles while lying low in the water. They have sharp canine tusks and can open their mouth up to 150 degree. The eyes, ears and nostrils are placed at the same level at the top of the head as an adaption to aquatic life style. It spends much of its day in water wallowing, swimming, sleeping and relaxing and come out of water during night for grazing. The young ones are born inside water. They swim and dive well. These giants are currently at risk from habitat loss. For the first time two hippopotamus (one female from Guwahati zoo in September, 1991 and one male from Vandalur zoo, Chennai in October, 1993) were brought and then bred successfully. Presently, Nandankanan has 11 hippopotamus (5M: 6F) in exhibits. The hippopotamus pool is the largest pool in India.

UNIQUENESS OF NANDANKANAN

- Host zoo for white tigers. White tigers were born to normal coloured parents in 1980. It is also first zoo where melanistic tiger were born (2014) and displayed to visitors
- First zoo in the country where endangered Gharials were born in captivity (in 1980).
- A unique white tiger safari was established in the Zoological Park on 1st October, 1991.
- Wonderful site for wildlife conservation and education where one can experience integration of ex-situ and in-situ conservation of wild fauna and flora.
- Presence of Kanjia Lake- A wetland of National Importance (2006)
- Conservation Breeding Centre for Indian Pangolin and Long billed vultures.
- Nandankanan has largest enclosures for housing Gharials and Hippopotamus in the country.
- Second largest heronry for open billed storks in Odisha.
- Has a Captive Fodder Farm (over 33 Acs.) and a Slaughter house to cater the dietary needs of animals housed in the Zoological Park.
- First record of breeding of Indian Ratels in captivity (in 2012).
- First zoo after which a train has been named as "Nandankanan Express" (12815/12816- Puri-New Delhi-Puri) - operating since December, 2011.
